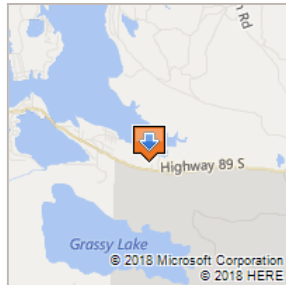

Hunting Incident Investigation Academy IHEA-USA

Academy Purpose: This academy is designed to train active Wildlife Officers on how to properly investigate hunting related shooting incidents and properly document the facts to their respective agency's Hunter Education Administrator.

Registration Fee: \$600.00 All funds payable to the International Hunter Education Association - USA (IHEA-USA). This fee will cover the student manual and supplies/instruction materials. This fee will also cover lunches served on site during the training. Enrollment in the academy will be limited to 40 students.

Mission: To provide skill, knowledge, and confidence to Wildlife Officers in the collection and reporting of data in the research of hunting related shooting incidents.

Academy Overview: The five day academy will cover the following topics: policies, planning an investigation, tools of the investigation, bullet-path reconstruction, evidence kits, ballistics, blood analysis, evidence collection, diagramming, methodology of the hunting investigation, treestand falls and scenarios.

Time/Location: Participants are encouraged to arrive on Sunday, March 3. The academy begins promptly at 08:00 A.M. on Monday, March 4. The academy will conclude by 12:00PM on Friday, March 8. Classes will be held at the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission's Law Enforcement Training Facility in Mayflower, Arkansas.

Student Responsibilities: Students are responsible for all travel, lodging, and meals during travel. If students are traveling by air they should fly into [Clinton National Airport](#) in Little Rock. If you need transportation from and to the airport, please notify [Michael Brooks](#) of your needs as soon as possible so we can make arrangements to cover your transportation needs.

Lodging Option: This facility has rooming accommodations for 30 students total. Arkansas is sending ten students to the training so there will be 20 room available on a first come, first serve basis. The general layout of the rooms are two double beds with two rooms sharing a restroom. Students staying at the LE training facility will need to bring their own towels and personal effects; bedding is provided.

Students whom are not able to get a room at the training facility or wish to stay offsite will need to make their own lodging reservations. There is a block of rooms being held for the academy at the [Hampton Inn](#), Maumelle, Arkansas located at 11920 Maumelle Boulevard. Reservations can be made by calling direct to the hotel at 501-851-6600. Be sure to tell them you are with the Hunting Related Shooting Incident Investigation Academy to ensure the guaranteed rate.

Meals: All meals consumed on site during the academy are included in the registration fee. Students will be responsible for meals consumed during travel to and from the academy. If students choose to check out the local eating establishments in Conway for dinner, the training facility will need to know a day in advance before you plan to miss dinner. Students and instructors staying at the Hampton Inn will have free breakfast available.

Transportation: Airport pick ups and drop offs can be arranged by contacting Michael Brooks at Michael.Brooks@mdc.mo.gov. Transportation to and from the hotel and training site each day will be provided.

Equipment Needs: Students should bring clothing suitable for field investigation work and rain gear. Students should also bring their camera, GPS, and laptop. An email will be sent out to students prior to the academy start with any other last minute details and/or equipment they should bring.
